

## HOW TO PLANT AND CARE FOR

# BEE HAPPY SEED BALLS!

Choose a **time** to plant:

In our climate, early spring (March) is a good time - there is little risk of frost and there is likely to be rain to help the seeds germinate and grow.

Choose a **place** to plant:

Make sure it is a sunny place (6 or more hours of sun per day).

Remove any rocks and weeds.

Bury the seed ball half way and water.

**Care** for your new seedlings:

Seeds in balls have a head start with soil to protect and nourish them but they will do better with your help.

Keep an eye on them (be patient, it can take weeks for some seeds to decide the conditions are right to grow) and offer the seedlings water as needed.

**With your stewardship, they will become flowers to make you and the bees happy!**
